Council President Scull advised that Councilman Cartier had requested this be pulled at the last meeting due to his concerns regarding the dangers of artificial turf. Council President Scull noted that the Recreation Director asked that it be considered again and had provided additional information regarding the artificial turf also advising that there was a submission deadline for the grant. Council President Scull asked the Township Engineer, Ms. Willis, if she had anything to add to the discussion. Ms. Willis advised that she had done the research for this grant with the Recreation Director. Ms. Willis explained that this grant requires that certain groups do the testing on the materials used to ensure they are safe. Mr. Gonzalez noted that in the literature provided, the material the grant is proposing to be used is safer than grass turf. Council President Scull asked about the time limits to submit and grant and Ms. Willis confirmed that the deadline is the end of September. Mr. Gonzalez added that the approval they are seeking from Council is just to apply for the grant and Council will have another opportunity to say yes or no, if they are awarded the grant. Council President Scull noted that she does have her concerns with the chemicals but feels better that the materials will be tested. Ms. Willis advised there is a required site plan for the grant and Adams, Rehmann and Heggan will be donating that.

Parade Permit Applications (PUBLIC HEARING REQUIRED)

Iva Klemick of First Baptist Church of Browns Mills for third annual Block Party Funday to be held on September 21, 2013, from 7am-4pm (food, games, etc.) at Sunbury Village, Kinsley Road, from Emmons St. to Norcross Ave.

President Scull opened the meeting to the public for comments on the parade permit. There being no members of the public indicating a desire to be heard, the meeting was closed to comments on the permit.

Motion by Allen and Stinney to approve parade permit application. Allen, yes; Stinney, yes; Scull, yes. Motion carried.

Soroptimist International for Candle Light Vigil in Memory of Victims of Domestic Violence at the South Lakeshore Peace Garden on October 18, 2013 at 5:30 p.m. (Note: Organization requested date change from October 4th to October 18th, requires another public hearing and Council vote.)

President Scull opened the meeting to the public for comments on the parade permit. There being no members of the public indicating a desire to be heard, the meeting was closed to comments on the permit.

Motion by Stinney and Allen to approve parade permit application. Stinney, yes; Allen, yes; Scull, yes. Motion carried.

Council President Scull asked the Mayor if there was continued vandalism at the Soroptimist Peace Garden. Mayor Patriarca advised that there are some small issues but nothing substantial and encouraged everyone and the media to attend. Councilwoman Stinney advised it is a very good event.

Discussion and possible introduction of Ordinance amending Chapter 188 of the Township Code entitled Wildlife Feeding in order to prohibit the feeding of wildlife on private property.

Councilwoman Scull commented that she understands the resident's concerns regarding the problem with the geese, but feels this ordinance is too much like big brother getting involved in what people can do on their private property and she would not approve the ordinance the way it is written. Mayor Patriarca noted the intent was more to control the geese and ducks and the ordinance should be written to that end and suggested that certain zones should be less restrictive. Mr. Gonzalez asked that Council Members to share their thoughts on how the ordinance should be written and they could put something together. It was a consensus of Council to not consider this ordinance as written and it should be

rewritten to be more focused on the issue of the feeding of the geese and ducks.

WHEREAS, THE TOWNSHIP OF PEMBERTON WILL UTILIZE THE ONLINE AUCTION SERVICES OF EMEX, LLC, AN APPROVED VENDOR PURSUANT TO THE ACT, WAIVER NUMBER EMEX LLC-1, LOCATED AT WWW.ENERGYMARKETEXCHANGE.COM; AND
WHEREAS, EMEX, LLC IS COMPENSATED FOR ALL SERVICES RENDERED THROUGH THE PARTICIPATING SUPPLIER THAT A CONTRACT IS AWARDED TO; AND
WHEREAS, THE AUCTION WILL BE CONDUCTED PURSUANT TO THE ACT.
NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS RESOLVED BY THE MUNICIPAL COUNCIL OF THE TOWNSHIP OF PEMBERTON THAT A CERTIFIED COPY OF THIS RESOLUTION BE FORWARDED BY THE MUNICIPAL CLERK TO THE DIVISION OF LOCAL GOVERNMENT SERVICES; AND
IT IS FURTHER RESOLVED, THAT DAVID PATRIARCA, MAYOR OF THE TOWNSHIP OF PEMBERTON IS HEREBY IS AUTHORIZED TO EXECUTE ON BEHALF OF THE TOWNSHIP OF PEMBERTON ANY ELECTRICITY CONTRACT PROFFERED BY THE PARTICIPATING SUPPLIER THAT SUBMITS THE WINNING BID IN THE EMEX REVERSE AUCTION.

Motion by Allen and Stinney to add Resolution No. 190-2013 to the agenda. Allen, yes; Stinney, yes; Scull, yes. Motion carried.

Mayor Patriarca explained why Administration requested this be added to the agenda. The company that they went out to bid with last year is going out to bid now for the next round because they see a trend of the electricity rates rising so they wanted to take advantage of the lower rates now. Mayor Patriarca further explained that Green Mountain came in as the lowest bidder again and there would only be a tenth of a cent increase for the next two years over the rate we have been paying and by doing this now it would lock us in at that price. Council President Scull asked for an estimate of how much we saved over the last year by changing the energy provider. Mayor Patriarca advised that he had already requested a report from Finance on that and is waiting for the report. Mr. Gonzalez noted that this is only for the electricity that the Township pays for their buildings, it is not township wide.

Motion by Allen and Stinney to adopt Resolution No. 190-2013. Allen, yes; Stinney, yes; Scull, yes. Motion carried.

General Public Comments

President Scull opened the meeting to the public for general comments. Those commenting were:

Bill Hurney, Lakeshore Mobile Village – 1. Commented that he was looking for the Township's Emergency Action Plan and was unable to find it on the website. Mayor Patriarca said that it could be put on the Township website and Craig Augustoni is the Township Emergency Management Coordinator.

Thomas Maahs, Presidential Lakes – 1. Commented that he was confused about membership questions in the new ordinance because he read that the members of current organizations would automatically be members in the consolidated organization. **2.** Expressed that no Presidential Lakes Fire Company members will destroy or dismantle any Township owned property.

American Phillips, Presidential Lakes – 1. Commented on the entrance to Presidential Lakes not being cut and it was seen by all the people that came for triathlon. Council President Scull asked the Mayor to check with Public Works on the upkeep of the public areas of Presidential Lakes. **2.** Commented on the decision that Council made regarding the consolidation of the Fire and EMS and feels Presidential Lakes was forgotten about. Questioned if there was an agreement with Woodland Township and it was noted that there is no current agreement with Woodland Township beside the mutual aid agreement. **3.** Ms.

Phillips commented on the condition of their building and Council President Scull commented that she does not believe that anyone here wants to see that building closed and additionally, each Fire Department has done what they wanted to their building with no additional funding from the Township.

Solicitor's report:

Ms. Baker had no report.

Engineer's report:

Mrs. Willis reported: 1. Bayberry Dam construction has started and water flow will be maintained at all times.

Council President Scull asked what the status was with the Country Lakes Dams. Ms. Willis noted that DEP and Dept. of Fish and Wild Life have been very busy but our submission was being reviewed. They have been advised that the Township wants to bid by the end of the year.

Planner's report:

Mr. Reagan reported: 1. Dialysis Center has worked out their issues with the County. 2. Dollar General will be starting construction soon. 3. Commented on the fire at the Dietz and Watson plant and the issues the solar panels cause would be looked into for future construction.

Mayor's and/or Business Administrator's report

Mayor Patriarca reported:

Mayor Patriarca had no report.

Council President Scull asked about the Sun Bank location and if we knew what kind of business they planned on putting in there. Ms Willis advised she did not know but is working with Sun Bank and the new owners to get the storm water maintenance agreements transferred over.
