


## PEMBERTON TOWNSHIP ALLIANCE GROUP







### **Code Enforcement**

### **ARE YOU A RENTER?**

If you are a resident of Pemberton who rents a home or apartment in town, be aware that the Township's Department of Community Development is the agency entrusted with ensuring that rental units comply with the Township's Rental Properties Code.

Most landlords use reasonable efforts to furnish rental units that provide suitable living conditions. In fact, before a rental unit can be leased to a new tenant, the unit must undergo an inspection by the Code Enforcement Division within Community Development. If Code Enforcement identifies deficiencies in the condition of a rental unit, it may preclude the landlord from renting the unit until the deficiencies are corrected. On occasion, the Construction Official may get involved to ensure that any corrections performed obtain the proper permits and are accomplished according to construction code.

For long term tenants, the rental code also requires re-inspection by the Code Enforcement Division at least once every five years.

What happens when the condition within a rental unit causes the dwelling or a portion of it to become uninhabitable or perhaps uncomfortable? It is the landlord's obligation to correct the condition. According to the Township's Rental Properties Code, the landlord must furnish the name and telephone number of an Agent or Managing Agent (also known as a Property Manager) to respond to emergency situations, such as when the dwelling loses heating or cooling, suffers a water burst or sewer blockage, or the property suffers major damage.

If a landlord or its managing agent fails to promptly repair the condition, a tenant may request assistance from the Code Enforcement Division to get the condition corrected. Code Enforcement is authorized to conduct health, safety and welfare inspections of rental units upon 48 hours' notice to a landlord unless an emergency exists. In the event of an emergency, Code Enforcement can conduct an inspection almost immediately with the tenant's consent to enter the dwelling. Landlords who fail to make repairs are also subject to penalties and potentially the loss of their rental license. In the unlikely event that the Township must pursue the forfeiture of a landlord's rental license, the Township will work with the renter and property owner to find suitable arrangements until the problem is resolved.

It is the goal of Code Enforcement to assist residents with making sure the units they are renting remain in compliance with the Township's Rental Properties Code. Code Enforcement can be reached Mondays through Fridays between 8:00 AM – 4:30 PM at (609) 894-3332.

#### **SEWER**

Homeowners are responsible for blockages that occur in their lateral between the house and the sewer main. As a courtesy, we will come out to try and plunge your sewer vent. In most cases homeowners will need to contact a plumber. Contact our Sewer Plant at 609-894-4343 for any questions regarding blockages.

#### RECYCLING

Recycling is single stream; paper, cardboard, bottles and cans will all go into the blue recycling tote. Recycling is picked up every other Thursday. If your Recycling is not picked up, call the recycling hot line at 609-267-6889.

Cardboard, paper, commingled may be dropped off 24 hours and put in the appropriate containers located behind the Municipal Building.

# COMPUTER/TELEVISION RECYCLING (Only residents with ID)

Please call 609-836-5258 first to be sure our container is not full. Please note that small appliances, VCRs, and stereo equipment may not be dropped off at Public Works and should be placed with your regular trash.

Services performed by the Streets & Roads division include:

- Snow Removal As soon as snow starts to fall or ice starts to accumulate on roadways salting and sanding of roadways begin. Plowing begins after 3" to 4" of snow.

#### **BRUSH**

Brush collection is done by appointment throughout the year. Brush must be at curb or edge of a public road only. Brush must be placed parallel to the road, pointed in the same direction as traffic. Curbside must be clear of motor vehicles so township equipment has access. No material with a trunk larger than 6" in diameter can be accepted. Brush or tree trimmings should be as long as possible, but not exceed twelve feet in length. Volume for brush piles; no larger than 12 ft. length x 6 ft. width x 4 ft. height. Do not bundle. No briars,





thorns, poison ivy, oak, sumac or vines may be placed in the brush pile. Wood boards, decking, fencing, construction material, etc. is not acceptable. No stumps. Residents are limited to two scheduled brush pick ups per year. Material from the clearing of a property is not eligible. No material left from a contractor performing work on private property will be picked up. Commercial businesses are ineligible. # **Pemberton Township Police Department**

# The Pemberton Township Police in conjunction with the Burlington County Prosecutor's Office offers....

This program affords an alternative to addiction by providing access to counseling services every Tuesday between 12:00 p.m. and 5 p.m. Anyone with an addiction may come to the police department where they will be connected with a counselor who will assist them in getting into treatment.



### **Traffic Complaints:**

The Pemberton Township Police Department is committed to enforcing traffic violations in the township with emphasis on safety in the neighborhoods. Between January 1st, 2022 and December 31st, 2022 our agency conducted 9,428 traffic stops and issued 5,692 traffic tickets for violations occurring throughout our Township. To better serve the community we have created a shared email address to send traffic complaints to. The email address is: traffic@pembertonpolice.com. Any complaints sent to this email address will automatically go to our Traffic Safety Officers, Sergeants and Command Staff for the Police Department. We encourage the community members to let us know where traffic violations are occurring, including the most common time of day for the violations, so that we can better plan enforcement for those areas.

#### **Animal Control:**

Pemberton Township contracts our animal control services. There is some important information regarding those services that residents should know:

Collection of Contained, Non-Injured Domestic Animals – Occurs Monday through Friday during the business hours of 8:00am and 4:30pm. We will ask residents who contain stray animals to keep them contained until such time as the animal control officer can arrive to remove them. Including after hours. If the animal is injured and/or a public safety hazard the on-duty police supervisor can make the determination of calling the animal control officer after hours for emergency pickup.

### Implementation of the L.E.A.D. Program

#### (Law Enforcement Against Drugs and Violence)

On November 8, 2022, Patrolman Laquan Jett began teaching the L.E.A.D. Curriculum to the 5th grade students at the Marcus Newcomb Middle School.

# **Pemberton Township Water Division**

The Township of Pemberton owns and operates four separate water supply systems serving 5,248 accounts and pumping approximately 1,000,000 gallons of water daily. Our customers who live and work in Browns Mills, New Lisbon, Lake Valley, Oak Pines, and Pemberton

Heights depend on the Water Division of the Pemberton Township Department of Public Works for clean, safe, and healthy water services. The operation, maintenance, and repairs of our four water systems are strictly regulated by the New Jersey Department of Environmental Protection, and our Water Division staff work within defined parameters to operate, maintain, test, and treat our water supply. Water is delivered to Pemberton Township customers from 6 Wells and 3 Tanks in Browns Mills, 2 Wells and 1 Tank in New Lisbon, 1 Well in Lake Valley, and 1 Well and 1 Tank in Oak Pines. The water flows through a network system that includes 86 miles of main distribution lines, additional service lines, and 600 fire hydrants. Through an interlocal agreement, Pemberton Boro supplies potable water to the Pemberton Heights section of our town. Lastly, our system located in Browns Mills also provides an emergency interconnection to two private mobile home parks if needed.



#### **HYDRANT FLUSHING**

Throughout the course of several months to a year, loose sediment and mineral deposits may slowly build up inside of the water mains resulting in discolored water and reduced capacity. Flushing the water mains can remove the sediment and mineral build up, and improve the color, odor and taste of the water if it has become problematic. Unidirectional flushing at the minimum required velocity will improve the carrying capacity of the mains. Because of this, in an effort to provide clean and safe potable water to



Pemberton Township, our Water Division personnel typically flush hydrants once annually. Beginning in 2023, we are increasing our hydrant flushing program to twice per annum. We believe that the additional hydrant flushing will add a level of proactiveness to our water supply maintenance, and further ensure an adequate supply of clean and healthy water for all of our customers.

When maintenance is performed, residents in the immediate vicinity may experience temporary discoloration of their water. This discoloration primarily consists of harmless silt and mineral deposits, and does not affect the safety of the water.

#### What should you do if you experience water discoloration due to fire hydrant flushing?

If you notice that your water is discolored, it can be cleared by running cold water from a faucet within your home for a few minutes. Do not use hot water or do laundry as it could cause sediment to accumulate in the hot water system and/or cause clothing to become discolored. Please note that the Pemberton Township Water Division is not responsible for any damage resulting in discolored water.

#### Is your water safe to drink after hydrant flushing?

Yes, your water is safe to drink. Flushing is done to remove sediment from the pipes in order to maintain water clarity and quality in the system. These actions as well as some construction activities and broken line repairs may result in brief periods during which you may observe moderate discoloration at the tap.

If you experience discolored water conditions that last more than a day, please contact the Pemberton Township Water Division at 609 894 3373.

### **HYDRANT FLUSHING**

Pemberton Townships semi-annual flushing of fire hydrants removes minerals and  $\emptyset$  sediment that build up over time and ensures that all fire hydrants are in good working order.



Please be advised that you may experience a drop in water pressure as well as some discoloration of the water during this process. Generally, this will clear up by running **COLD** water for several minutes.

Although the water is safe to use during this time, residents should refrain from doing laundry when water is discolored and avoid running hot water, as mineral sediments can accumulate in your water heater






